Recap of the Public Informational Hearing for Town Meeting  
Thursday, February 25, 2021, 7:00 PM

The hearing lasted for almost exactly an hour. There were 27 Zoom connections. Nine connections were taken by the selectboard (5), town moderator, town clerk/treasurer, town administrator, and minute taker. Additional connections were taken by presenters listed below.

Selectboard Chair Larry Wyckoff opened the hearing a few minutes after 7 PM. After his opening remarks, the following people presented reports:

- Sally Laughlin – Krusch Nature Preserve on behalf of the Cambridge Conservation Commission
- Selectboard Member Courtney Leitz – on behalf of the library
- Selectboard Member Dana Sweet – highway budget surplus, roads
